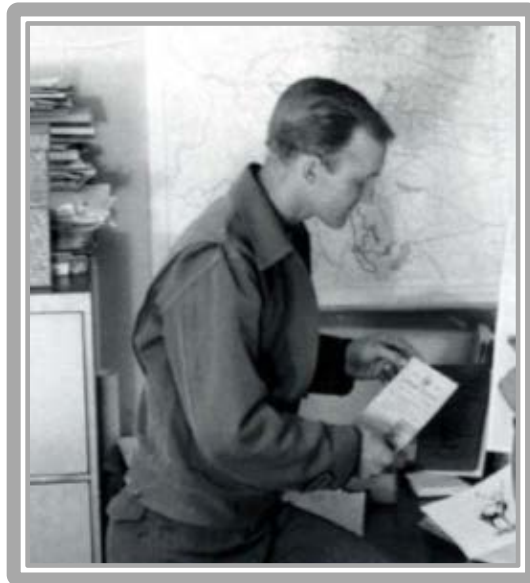


HONORARY TWS MEMBERSHIP

1989 – John G. Stelfox



Positions: Research Scientist & Wildlife Biologist, Canadian Wildlife Service

Accomplishments: After getting his Ph.D. at the University of Montana, Dr. John Stelfox worked as a biologist with the Department of Lands and Forests in Alberta, and as a wildlife biologist and research scientist for the Canadian Wildlife Service. Dr. Stelfox's work on wildlife biology greatly influenced conservation and management of wildlife in Alberta. He worked extensively on effects of forestry activities on Alberta's wildlife, particularly on big game such as ungulates and bear, and he also conducted research on ecology of bighorn sheep. Dr. Stelfox also contributed significantly to recording the history of wildlife and landscape management, through his writings, and by preserving critical historical documents such as letters by Grey Owl and John Dewey Soper.

John Stelfox's accomplishments have been recognized by naming the John Stelfox Wildlife Service Collection within the Society of Alberta Archives after him.
