Position: Professor, University of Northern British Columbia

Accomplishments: Dr. Gillingham is well known for his research in population and wildlife ecology, plant-herbivore interactions, and behavioural ecology, with a particular focus on combining empirical data with mathematical models to accomplish these goals. His research has included understanding drivers of moose declines in British Columbia in collaboration with the BC Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resources, and on understanding effects of moose and wolf distributions on woodland caribou. He has published extensively in a wide variety of wildlife-oriented journals including Ecological Applications, Journal of Wildlife Management, and Journal of Animal Ecology, as well as producing reports for government agencies to increase the impacts of his research on management and policy decisions.
