- Post-secondary education from an approved technical school or university with a diploma or degree in Natural Resources, Environmental Science, Biology, or other related field, or an equivalent combination of education, training, and experience.
- Experience collecting, managing, and analyzing data from biological field programs.

- Strong analytical, problem solving and decision-making skills.
- · Strong interpersonal skills with the ability to maintain good working relationships with a variety of staff and stakeholders.

Desired:

Duties:

Under the supervision of the Regional Wildlife Manager, the incumbent will be responsible for collecting, organizing, and analyzing data for the Wildlife and Fisheries Management programs in the Eastern region. Wildlife programs include surveys related to

wildlife habitat assessments and population monitoring, particularly for species at risk files (e.g. caribou). Fisheries programs will include fish stock assessments, fish stocking, creel surveys, and lake sturgeon tagging programs.
